The painting captures a day in 2006 when more than one million Angelenos marched in downtown L.A. for immigration reform. There's a young immigrant girl in the forefront wearing a t-shirt that says **"Don't deport, love."** One of the demonstrators holds a sign that reads: "We fight to keep the American Dream alive in the heart of her people." And, if you look closely, you can see Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Archbishop Oscar Romero, and even a few Bresee staff scattered among the masses.

Adrian Navarette labored over this project for six months in 2013. He wanted to show our young people how long it takes to create a grand piece of art, and he wanted them to know that art can be used as a tool for social justice.

All these years later, our youth and families must still fight for basic civil rights. And yet when I look at this painting – a great work created with great care – it reminds me that our commitment to social justice is a long-term proposition and even in the face of hostility, we can model our love for this community by doing our work in a way that honors their dreams and potential. NEW AT BRESEE IN 2017



An Exciting Partnership with L.A.'s Newest Soccer Club

In 2017, Major League Soccer's Los Angeles Football Club (LAFC) formed its first official community partnership with Bresee as sponsor of Bresee's LAFC Youth Leadership Program. Twentynine LAFC Youth Leaders completed work readiness training in the summer of 2017 before conducting soccer and character development classes for 232 students at six local elementary and middle schools.



The Best Buy Teen Tech Center Turns One!

In its first full year of operation, Bresee's Tech Center worked with an exciting array of partners to help young adults develop a passion for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) learning. First year partners included the Best Buy Geek Squad Academy, The Grammy Foundation, Girls Who Code, Upright Citizens Brigade, EveryoneOn, and CyberSeniors. The Teen Tech Center is also a proud member of The Clubhouse Network, a global community founded 25 years ago in collaboration with the MIT Media Lab.



Bresee Hires Its First Director of Evaluation and Learning

With an investment from the W.M. Keck Foundation, Bresee welcomed Cynthia Cortez as the new Director of Evaluation and Learning in October of 2017. Cynthia is a native Angeleno with a master's degree in social research methodology from UCLA, and a fierce commitment to improving programs that serve low-income communities. She will play a critical role in the implementation and success of the new strategic plan.

BRESEE FAMILY SERVICES

Bresee's Central Los Angeles/Koreatown community is one where working families struggle to cover expenses and live one emergency away from financial crisis. Bresee's Wilshire FamilySource Center offers a suite of free, onsite resources to help families weather crises and build their personal financial assets through **ESL and computer literacy classes**, **Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and financial coaching, immigration legal services, and emergency rental, transportation, and food assistance.**

Eloisa, Ephrain, Steven and Axel S.

Eloisa and Ephrain S. have partnered with Bresee for over six years to prepare their children for the future. Steven, their oldest son, graduated from Bowdoin College in June 2018 with help from a Bresee scholarship. Axel, their youngest, completed a paid high school internship with the LAFC Youth Leadership Program. Last year Axel and his mother also took Bresee financial literacy classes and began earning a savings match through Individual Development Accounts.

In April 2017, crisis struck. Ephrain was in a serious car accident and unable

to work. Eloisa took on additional hours at her part-time job but couldn't cover the family's living expenses and medical bills. Determined not to disrupt Steven's college experience, they approached Bresee and received 2 months of emergency support. As the family regains stability, Steven and Axel understand their parents' sacrifice.

As Axel heads off to college with support from a Bresee scholarship he shared, "I really love my family, because we have trust in each other," he says. "I want to one day tell them, Don't worry about it. I've got this."

BRESEE YOUTH SERVICES

Community-based organizations like Bresee can play an important, complementary role in combatting inequities in our education system. Bresee **athletic programs** provide teams and leagues so that local youth can remain active and build character. The **middle school program** provides enrichment activities and helps students with homework and study skills so they enter high school in good standing, while the **college access, internship, and Tech Center programs** orient young adults toward the future and increase their preparedness for college and the workforce.

Jonathan G.

At age 15, Jonathan G.'s proudest accomplishment is a handwritten letter penned by a fan who discovered his music on SoundCloud. Jonathan's track, "Mixed Emotions," is about loving a parent who is caught in an abusive relationship. Raised in similar circumstances, Jonathan's song moved his first fan.

Two years ago, Jonathan had no outlet for his emotions. His mother was concerned about how he spent his time after school, and asked Bresee staff to take her son under their wing. At Bresee, Jonathan signed up for sound- and video-editing workshops in the Teen Tech Center, learning to use Garage Band and Avid Pro Tools software.

Since then, Jonathan has self-produced two albums. He is a frequent visitor during the Tech Center's open lab hours, and uses the sound booth, camera equipment, and computers to record songs and make music videos. Finishing his freshman year in June 2018, he is working toward his dream of producing music for other artists.

GANG PREVENTION

There are 13 active gangs in the City of Los Angeles' Gang Reduction and Youth Development (GRYD) Olympic Zone, where Bresee is located, and the majority recruit new members in their early teens. To interrupt this cycle, the City hones in on youth who exhibit nine risk factors strongly correlated with gang involvement (e.g. antisocial tendencies, guilt neutralization, weak parental supervision).

Bresee uses these risk factors, as the Olympic Zone's primary prevention provider, to identify 10-15 year olds eligible for the program. Youth enroll with their families and engage in family coaching, individual mentorship, and youth group activities to reduce risk factors and increase protective factors (e.g. social connections, self-regulation, close relationships with caring adults).

Chelsy M.

Chelsy is a former gang prevention client and recent high school intern for the GRYD team. She came to Bresee as the result of her mother's intensive effort to keep her from joining a local crew. Co-enrolled in the gang prevention and middle school programs, she quickly blossomed, discovering a passion for dance and community service.

In 2016, Chelsy's family lost their home and belongings to a house fire. After living with relatives for several months, the family secured an apartment through a partner agency, but still lacked basic furniture and household amenities. Bresee's Family Services team leveraged funds from the California Community Foundation to help the family purchase kitchenware and kitchen, living room, and bedroom furniture, providing dignity and additional stability in a time of crisis.

In the 2017-18 school year, Chelsy worked as a paid youth intern with the GRYD team, bringing personal insight and passion to her work. In fall, she launched and facilitated Self Me/Self Love, a girls group focused on building self-esteem and confidence. In spring semester, she led a Zumba class for GRYD youth and Bresee staff. In the fall of 2018, Chelsy will attend California State University – Channel Islands, and her GRYD family couldn't be prouder of her journey and growth.

DOING GREAT WORK WITH GREAT CARE: BRESEE'S FUTURE

This is the spirit that our leadership and Board embraced when developing a new strategic plan to guide Bresee into its next chapter. The plan comes on the heels of six straight years of program, budget, and staffing growth. Since 2012, Bresee has increased the number of clients served from 1,500 to nearly 3,000, while the budget has grown from \$1.5 to \$3 million and our staff from 25 to more than 50. Now, as we look forward, we recognize that Bresee is not called on to expand its services further, but rather to deepen the impact of our existing programs by investing in staff development, program and curriculum design, and the systems that support our organization.

In the 2017-18 school year, Bresee embarked on a new strategic planning process. Led by facilitators from the Executive Service Corps, the strategic planning committee gathered feedback from clients, staff, financial supporters, and other key stakeholders, revisited and updated Bresee's vision and mission, and crafted a plan that will steer our organization toward greater impact in the community.
